Position Regarding Gov. Inslee's Allowance of Residential Construction

Yakima, WA—April 24, 2020 — Governor Inslee's recent announcement to reopen some residential construction projects comes after a month of hard work, planning, collaborative efforts and letters into the governor.

Understanding that many difficult and rapid decisions have needed to be made, the Central Washington Home Builders Association (CWHBA) wishes to thank the jurisdictions and elected officials who have been instrumental in supporting efforts to allow residential construction to safely continue. Construction work is a huge part of our communities and the economy throughout Central Washington, and since the governor's order went into effect on March 25th, the construction industry in the State of Washington has lost an estimated \$690,000,000 in family wages (\$23 million per day based on Building Industry Association of WA's latest economic report).

However, even with this new construction allowance for the Stay-at-Home order, the industry will not continue with "business-as-usual". **CWHBA continues to endorse that safety on all construction sites is, and will maintain, a priority**. As residential construction reopens, contractors will be required to adhere to Phase 1 Construction Restart COVID-19 Job Site
